10. Framework

With framework if the study is social science and no framework if the study is experimental. Contains theories and concepts that underpin the study objectives and methodologies.

11. Objectives

Limit to 2 or 3. Stated in terms of what the researcher will do with the data rather than research activities.

12. Methodology

Materials and Methods for science studies. If the study deals with human subjects, an informed consent is needed. If study deals on animals, ethics protocol for animal subjects is needed. If about plants, a gratuitous permit is needed. In such cases, a clearance for an ethics review Board is required.

13. Results and Discussion

Maybe separated for science studies. Must be supported by continental literature. Data Presentation by Objectives Theory Generation Critique of the Methodology

14. Conclusions

Answers the objectives; Judgment of the findings.

15. Recommendations

Optional; needed if recommendations have international application
